

STUDENT UNION FEE

The Studierendenwerk is financed by revenue from the halls of residence, refectories and cafeterias, grants from the state of Baden–Württemberg and the semester fees paid by students.

Purpose of the contribution

With the amount to be paid each semester, you contribute to financing the social services of the Studierendenwerk (including refectories, halls of residence, daycare centres), which ultimately benefit all students.

Obligation to pay fees

The obligation to pay contributions applies to all enrolled students, including those on leave of absence.

Due date & payment

The fees are due upon enrolment/ re-registration at the respective university.

Reimbursement

In certain cases, for example a change of university at the beginning of the semester, the semester fee can be refunded subject to the deadlines. A refund is not possible in the case of a leave of absence.

Severely disabled students who are entitled to free use of local public trans– port due to their disability will receive a refund of the fee upon application and submission of proof (applications on the website).



SITE PLAN TÜBINGEN



HOUSING

Affordable rents, a student-driven environment and easy contact opportunities make halls of residence very popular with students. The Studierendenwerk offers a total of almost 6.000 dormitories at various locations. In addition to single rooms in shared flats, there are also single flats, barrier-free rooms and, at some locations, flats for students with children and for couples.

How can I apply?

You can **only apply online** for a place in one of our halls of residence. Multiple applications do not increase your chances of receiving an offer.

When should I apply?

As soon as you know that you will be studying at one of our locations. You can apply online even if you do not yet have a letter of admission or certificate of enrolment. You should submit the missing documents as soon as you receive them.

What happens after my application?

After applying online, you will receive an e-mail with your application details and further information. An e-mail with a link will be sent to you at regular intervals. To let us know that you are still interested in a room, you must confirm this link within five days. This is the only way you will remain in the applicant pool.

When are the room offers sent out?

The allocation of rooms begins two months before the start of the semester by e-mail. However, we need your complete application documents for this. This means that we cannot offer you a room without a letter of admission or certificate of enrolment.

How long is the regular rental period?

The regular rental period is limited in time and is usually six semesters. The rental contracts are semester contracts that can be cancelled by you at the end of each semester with two months' notice.

ONLINE APPLICATION





VISIT

Unfortunately, it is not possible to take a look inside the halls of residence as the rooms are always occupied. You can find descriptions and pictures of many halls of residence and rooms on our homepage. Due to high demand, we are unable to offer all applicants a dormitory place.

What happens when I move in?

Moving in is only possible from the start of the contract at 12.00 noon and only on working days during the caretakers' working hours. The tenant must pay a deposit of 600€ before the room is handed over. You will only receive the keys from your caretaker on presentation of proof that the deposit has been paid.

What equipment do the rooms have?

- Single flats are equipped with their own bathroom and kitchenette
- Shared apartments or flats share kitchen and sanitary facilities
- Rooms and flats are mostly furnished
- Mainly Internet and TV connection*
- Mostly washing machines and tumble dryers for a fee*

PAYMENT SYSTEM

Where can I top up my student card?

You can top up your student ID card at the top-up machines in the refectories and cafeterias. The transaction is made by direct debit, you do not need to enter your PIN code. Please use the payment terminals/ cash registers in the cafeterias or the Autoload service

Payment by debit/credit card or via Apple Pay/Google Pay

Only cashless payment is possible in all refectories and cafeterias. Payments can also be made via Apple Pay and Google Pay. Please prioritise using your student/ employee ID card or our refectory card to ensure a smooth process at the checkouts. If you have any questions about card payment, please contact one of our info points or send an email to kartenzahlung@

sw-tuebingen-hohenheim.de. Our team will contact you and arrange everything else.

What is Autoload?

The easiest and most convenient way to top up is via Autoload. With this service, you can top up your student card directly at the till as soon as your card balance falls below a set limit after a debit.







DID YOU KNOW?

- ... that in 2023 more than 40 % of the meals we served were meat-free.
- ... that with Autoload you don't have to queue at the top-up machines, but can top up your credit directly at the till.
- ... that in addition to our coffee, some of our lemonades, teas and sweets are Fairtrade products.

I have lost my current card/student ID card. What should I do?

If you lose your student ID card, you must inform the Studierendenwerk immedia– tely of the relevant card serial number (available from the Student Secretariat) so that the card can be blocked for further payment functions. To do this, you can contact the InfoPoint staff or report it at the cash desks with InfoPoint function. If you lose your debit card, please also inform the Studierendenwerk as soon as possible to prevent unauthorised trans– actions from the debit card to the ID card. ATTENTION: It is not sufficient to simply block the debitcard at the respective bank!



BAFÖG & FINANCING

The German Federal Training and Education Assistance Act (Bundesausbildungsförderungsgesetz – or BAföG for short) is the key to equal opportunities and educational justice in the German higher education system. The Studierendenwerke have been commissioned to implement the BAföG by the Federal and State governments – and they campaign for its continuous improvement. Unfortunately, foreign students are only entitled to receive BAföG under very special conditions. This, for example, is the case if the parents have worked in Germany for three years, if one parent is German, if the student is a recognized refugee or married to a German citizen or has a permanent residence permit. Our BAföG office in Reutlingen can determine if you are entitled to receive BAföG.

For questions concerning BAföG, there is a toll–free hotline available from the Federal Ministry of Education and Research. You can also contact our BAföG InfoPoints.

If you have any study-related, personal, social or legal problems, you can contact our various counselling centres. We also support students with children with childcare places, family accommodation and other services.

PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELLING

What issues can I come to counselling with?

If you are at a loss due to study-related or personal difficulties, we offer you professional support, for example with exam nerves and pressure to perform, writer's block, self-esteem or motivation problems, relationship conflicts, contact difficulties or depressive moods.

When and where does counselling take place?

Counselling takes place at our counselling centres in Tübingen, Hohenheim or via video. On Mondays from 8.45 am to 2.00 pm and Tuesdays to Thursdays from 8.45 am to 12.30 pm, you can register for an initial appointment by phone or in person at the office or by making an appointment online on our website. How much does counselling cost?

Counselling sessions are financed by the semester fee, among other things, and are therefore all free of charge and of course confidential in our counselling centre, regardless of the number of sessions.

Open consultation hours

Open consultation hours take place on Tuesdays from 12.30 pm to 3.00 pm at our counselling centre in Tübingen. Please note that you should come to the counselling centre the quarter of an hour before (i.e. between 12.15 pm and 12.30 pm) and register briefly at the secretary's office to attend the open consultation. This helps us to organise the consultation on the day in question. A maximum of 5 appointments of up to 25 minutes per person are available during open consultation hours.

LEGAL ADVICE

What topics can I get advice on?

Our expert will help you with legal problems relating to your studies. For example, if you have difficulties with your landlord, questions about examination law or if you haven't received your wages for your job.

STUDYING WITH A CHILD

How much are the fees for a child-care place?

In Tübingen, the fee is based on the city's scale of fees and in Hohenheim the costs amount to 198 euros per month. The fee includes a catering allowance of 80 euros.

What educational concept do the daycare centres follow?

The basis of our educational work in the daycare centres is to support children on their way to developing their own personality, building on their strengths and becoming independent. In doing so, we take their individual life situation into account and tailor our actions accordingly. In this way, we can offer students high– quality care, education and upbringing for their children that complements their families and helps them to combine their studies, career and family life.

What requirements do I have to fulfil to get a place in a daycare centre?

The following requirements apply to students for a place in one of the child– care centres:

- At least one parent must be enrolled at a university affiliated with the Studierendenwerk
- At least one parent must be resident at the respective daycare centre location



For students of the universities we operate one day care centre each in Tübingen and Hohenheim. At the university location in Reutlingen, we cooperate with the Tagesmütterverein e.V. Reutlingen.


